  - a. install fuel tanks
  - b. critical supplies
3. Generators – stationary and mobile
  - a. 2-week minimum capacity
  - b. Alternative fuel: propane
4. Emergency Shelters
  - a. Sanitation facilities
  - b. Coordinate with humane society
5. C.O.O.P
6. Buy-in with stakeholders
7. Intergovernmental agreements for emergency operations (mutual aid)

8. Public outreach / education
  - a. Cooperate with other agencies
9. Assign ESFs to local people
10. Document ways to operate and assist without power and internet
11. What does resiliency look like?
12. Identify emergency communication methods (ham radio, satellite phones)
