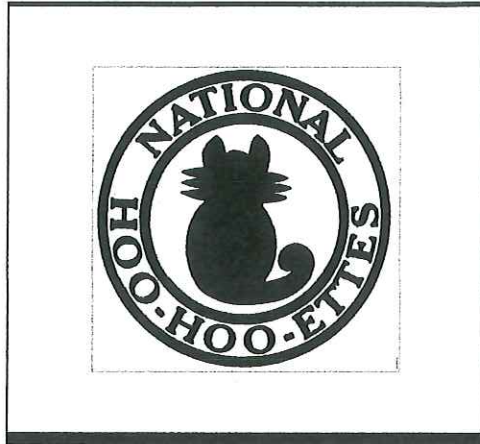


Scholarship

The History of Hoo Hoo Ettes



For fifty years members of the National Hoo-Hoo-Ette Club have been promoting friendship, education and philanthropy through an organization of women who are engaged in or have an interest in forestry and the wood products industry.

In 1951 a group of nine women from the Los Angeles area, led by Anne Murray, were encouraged by the men's national organization to form a club for women. From these humble beginnings the group expanded, establishing local clubs throughout the western states. To unify these local clubs a national organization was needed and in 1954 the National Hoo-Hoo-Ette Club was launched at a convention held in San Marino, California.

Hoo-Hoo-Ettes are a dedicated group. While fairly small in numbers, we are committed to friendly promotion of our industry, in which we have our livelihood or simply a vested interest. Though non-political, we feel we can promote the industry through educating our selves and others, foster goodwill among those engaged in the industry, and bring together women of similar interests in an atmosphere of fellowship.

Most local clubs meet once a month to take care of the business of the club and to perhaps have a speaker or a project on which to work. Each club has a charity project to sponsor not only with their money but often with their time. Local clubs are free to govern themselves and choose which project to sponsor, how their meeting is to be held, which social

events and fund raising events they wish to have.

The gathering of the local clubs at the national convention once a year is looked forward to and well attended. Held in a different location each year it gives the members a chance to see where our fellow members live and work. The two and a half day convention combines business meetings, an educational workshop, election and installation of national officers, an recognition ceremony and fellowship with old friends and new. Events may include a tour of a mill, a guided walk through the forest, a visit to a plywood plant, a speaker on a topic relating to the industry. Events vary, but all have the same basic theme, wood.

The national organization sponsors two philanthropic endeavors. A scholarship is given each year to a third or fourth year woman forestry student and we also donate to *Project Learning Tree*, a nation wide program that works through grade schools to promote a greater understanding of the past, present and future of the wood products industry.
