BMCC's Nursing program is a member of the Oregon Consortium for Nursing Education (OCNE); a shared curriculum with Oregon Health and Sciences University (OHSU). BMCC students are co-enrolled with OHSU and offered the same classes at a much lower tuition rate. BMCC graduates have the opportunity to begin working as a nurse immediately and, if desired may complete one additional year of study online to earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from OHSU
